# SPOTLIGHTS

**Bert Holfeltz** was approved to be a lifetime member of NAPM-Utah at the January 10, 2002 dinner meeting. He became a member of the Purchasing Management Association of Utah (PMAU) in February of 1984, and attended his first meeting at Weber State College, after a plant tour at White-Volvo. Bert ran for the PMAU Board of Directors elections in 1986, Bert was asked to serve as Public Relations Committee Chair by PMAU President Robert Nielsen.

He received the District I, "Public Relations Person-of-the-Year Award" in 1988. Bert served as the District I Public Relations Chair from 1989 to 1993, and received the NAPM "Public Relations Person-of-the-Year Award" at the Orlando Conference in 1992. Bert served as President of NAPM-Utah in 1991-93 and President of the National Purchasing Institute (NPI) in 1997-98, and was the 1992 NPI Conference Chair at the Annual NPI Conference in Salt Lake City. He received the Special Award for "Outstanding Service" from NPI in 1995, and the NAPM-Utah "Gordon Burt Affleck Award" in 1996. He earned the C.P.M. designation in August of 1988, Lifetime C.P.M. in May of 1993, and Lifetime A.P.P. in February of 1996.

Bert was on the Editorial Advisory Board of "Government Procurement Magazine" for three years. His biggest thrill was to serve on the NAPM Board of Directors, and be the District XII Director for two years, 1995-97. He also served as District XII Pro-D and Communication Committee Chair. Bert has enjoyed working in Contracts and Procurement for Salt Lake County. He was instrumental in Salt Lake County's Contracts and Procurement Division receiving the "Achievement of Excellence in Procurement Award" from the National Purchasing Institute for the last three years.

**Douglas Richins** is the Director of the Utah Division of Purchasing & General Services and the state's chief procurement officer. He was appointed to this position in 1985 by Governor Norman Bangertter, and was reappointed by Governor Michael Leavitt. Mr. Richins has management responsibility for the purchase of all supplies, equipment and services used by state government. The dollar amount of these purchases annually exceed 800 million dollars.

A Certified Purchasing Manager, Mr. Richins is the past president of the National Association of Purchasing Management - Utah, a professional organization of purchasing managers from government, education, manufacturing and industry in Utah. He has been a member of NAPM-Utah for over 20 years, serving in committees and all elected offices. In 1992 he was named as NAPM-Utah's "Purchasing Manager of the Year". He served as the Professional Development Chair for NAPM District 1 (Utah, Nevada, Arizona & California) from 1993 to 1996. In 1994-1995 he was elected the president of the National Association of State Purchasing Officials.

In 2000 he was honored by NASPO with its highest recognition, the "Distinguished Service Award", for his contributions to public procurement. He was a founder, and has also served as chairman of the Western States Contracting Alliance (WSCA), a cooperative purchasing organization of comprised of 16 western states.

Mr. Richins serves as the secretary of the Utah State Privatization Policy Board and the Utah State Procurement Policy Board. He works closely with education entities and local governments in the state, coordinating and managing cooperative purchasing ventures. He serves on the EdPAC and UPAC committees, which respectively actively work with purchasing issues for school districts and colleges & universities. Richins, a Kaysville native, received his college education at Weber State University.

Before being appointed as the state's chief procurement officer, he spent seven years as the purchasing director at Davis School District. Mr. Richins is married to the former Carol Brown, has three daughters and lives in Kaysville. He is active in his church and likes golf and skiing. He enjoys escaping the pressures of state purchasing to his ranch in Summit and Morgan counties where he raises cattle.

# ECONOMIC REPORT, MOUNTAIN STATES REGION, UTAH

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OMAHA, Neb. – The Mountain States economy dipped again in December, according to the Business Conditions Survey of purchasing managers and business leaders in the three-state region.

The overall index, a leading economic indicator, was below 50.0 for the fourth time in the past five months with a reading of 47.7, down from 48.4 in November. The December prices-paid index rose slightly to 47.7 from 47.5 in November, indicating that inflationary pressures, at least at the wholesale level, will likely remain tame in months to come.

“The Mountain States region is firmly in a recession with the downturn being particularly serious since September 11<sup>th</sup>. The economic pullback, which began in manufacturing, has now spread to other sectors, particularly the transportation industry,” Creighton University Economics Professor Ernie Goss said today.

“Despite the negative economic conditions, the Business Confidence index rose to 51.1 in December from November’s 47.3. It is clear that lower interest rates, bargain energy prices and a successful war effort are having positive impacts on survey participants’ economic outlook,” reports Goss.

“While the employment index remains low, December’s reading of 44.5 was an improvement over November’s reading of 42.7. This indicates that layoffs in the region may be slowing. However, the region has lost almost 50,000 jobs since September 11<sup>th</sup>. Based on surveys over the past several months, I expect these jobs losses to continue, albeit at a slower pace throughout Quarter I of 2002,” said Goss, who holds the Jack A. MacAllister Chair in Regional Economics.

“Furthermore, the new orders index hit its lowest level in almost two years with an index of 47.0, down from 49.5 in November. Export orders were down as well with a reading of 40.8, compared to November’s anemic 44.1. Weak domestic and export orders over the past several months foreshadow little improvement for the regional economy for the near term,” states Goss.

Goss conducts a monthly survey of purchasing managers and business leaders in three states to produce leading economic indicators of the Mountain States economy. Purchasing management associations in the respective states have been supporting the monthly survey for almost seven years.

The National Association of Purchasing Management began to formally survey its membership to gauge business conditions in 1931. Goss uses the same methodology as the national survey. The overall index ranges between 0 and 100. An index greater than 50 indicates expansionary economic conditions in the months ahead. The Utah Purchasing Management Association supports the regional survey.

The individual Mountain States overall indices for December were 41.6 in Colorado, 46.2 in Utah and 61.5 in Wyoming. Here are the individual purchasing management index figures for each state included in the survey and a brief analysis of the index:

**Utah:** Utah business leaders and purchasing managers reported weak economic conditions in the state for December as the state’s Business Conditions Index dropped below 50.0 for the sixth consecutive month. “December’s reading of 46.2 represented a slight decline from November’s weak 48.9. While Utah has lost only 2,700 since the beginning of the recession, surveys over the past several months indicate that job losses and unemployment are very likely to rise throughout Quarter I of 2002. As opposed to Colorado, Utah has not experienced significant economic pullbacks outside of manufacturing. Similar to previous surveys, December new orders of 45.8, production of 50.8 and employment of 41.2 signal that any economic rebound will not occur until Quarter II of 2002,” states Goss.

## BIOMETRICS?

Q: Can you tell me what a biometric signature is and compare it to a digital signature?

A digital "signature" is an electronic mark or file, which can be attached to messages and used to authenticate the originator. "I know it's really you who sent me this contract because you are the only one who has a password, code or key to be able to generate the authenticating file or encrypt the message." (Public Key Infrastructure (PKI) for example.) You can also have a third party involved (like Verisign) that authenticates the message. "Yep that's the special code we gave the originator to use."

A biometric signature would be like putting your fingerprint on the message. In this case the software not only records your signature, it also records how you sign (fast, slow, press hard, etc). The resulting file is unique to your biology and can be used to verify that you really are the one who signed.

Biometric "signatures" can also be used to include recognizing other biological characteristics not just a signature.

Either a scanner or software program creates a "signature" to put on messages from a biological characteristic of you. Fingerprints, voice prints, retina scans, hand scanners are all being used for this. The "signature" is attached to a document or used as a password just like a digital signature. Since the file is unique to your fingerprint, it can be verified as really being you instead of someone else.

We have hand scanner locks to get into some buildings here and I'm sure the Lockheed Skunk Works has biometric door locks. The hand scanner transmits the image to a computer, which verifies that it is really me before opening the door. Same thing would happen if the image was attached as a file to a document. You could also involve a third party to verify the "signature" was authentic.

Net Nanny ([www.netnanny.com](http://www.netnanny.com)) is now using this type of process so your computer literate kids can't hack their way past your parental lockout of the XFL web site.
